International company's training comes to MCC's Applied Technology Center

OMAHA, Neb. — Metropolitan Community College will host PotashCorp's Agriculture and Feed Group's training for their annual safety rodeo Wednesday and Thursday, 9 a.m. – 1 p.m. at the Applied Technology Center, 10407 State St.

Teams from PotashCorp's plants in Weeping Water, Nebraska; Joplin, Missouri; and Marseilles, Illinois, will train in Omaha for the national competition held in Rome, Georgia, where 10 teams from various PotashCorp divisions compete to see who can perform the given tasks the safest and most efficient.

Tasks that the competitors will train for this week at MCC include live fire exercises and search and rescue simulations.

"PotashCorp had been flying their Agriculture and Feed Group teams to Georgia to train for the competition, but this year they don't have to because there is a great training facility right here in Omaha at MCC's Applied Technology Center," said Earl Rudolph, fire science technology instructor.
