### **Sustainability lecture to highlight the future of transportation fuel technologies**

OMAHA, Neb. —Metropolitan Community College's Sustainability Leadership Presentation Series will host "Renewable & Clean Fuel Technologies: The Future of Transportation, Today" on Thursday, Oct. 2, 3:30–5 p.m., at MCC's Fort Omaha Campus, 30<sup>th</sup> and Fort streets, Building 10, Room 110. Three leading experts in the energy field will lead the presentation panel: Jim Stark, Green Plains Renewable Energy; Scott Williams, Omaha Biofuels Coop; Bill Moore, EV World. Christopher Swanson, program coordinator for alternative fuels at MCC, will moderate the discussion.

The event is free and open to the public. The experts will help answer how different fuel technologies can benefit air quality, climate and drivers. The speakers will cover topics ranging from electric vehicles, corn ethanol and advanced biofuels from next generation sources such as cellulosic biomass and algae.

The lecture is part of the 2014–15 Sustainability Leadership Presentation Series, a partnership between MCC, Central Community College, WasteCap Nebraska and Joslyn Institute for Sustainable Communities. The Sustainability Leadership Presentation Series seeks to bring sustainability-minded perspectives to Nebraska and foster discussion on topics related to sustainability, energy, the environment and their application to our daily lives. Lectures will be offered throughout the academic year on the first Thursday of the month (excluding January).
