OSHA training class to promote safe work environment

OMAHA, Neb. — Metropolitan Community College will be conducting a two-day OSHA construction safety training course on Thursday, March 12, 8 a.m.–4:30 p.m., and Friday, March 13, 8–11:30 a.m., at the College's Fremont Area Center, 9th and Broad streets.

The safety class is designed for all employees with the goal of maintaining a safe work environment. Participants will be introduced to a variety of construction guidelines and requirements and will also be trained on hazard identification, avoidance, control and prevention. Upon completion of the class, participants will receive an OSHA 1926 10-Hour Construction Completion Card through the National Safety Council and the Midwest OSHA Education Center.

"This course is a great way to learn more about safety in the work environment, and it's something beneficial to add to a résumé," said Todd Hansen, executive director of the Fremont Area Center.
