



Pre-Criminal Justice (PUCJO) A.S. to B.S in Criminal Justice

This guide lists MCC courses that meet the requirements for a PUCJO degree and prepare the student to transfer into the BS Criminal Justice program at UNO. Every effort has been made to ensure accuracy however, students should meet with an MCC advisor at least twice a year to review requirements for their intended degree. UNO may have more specific requirements. Students intending to transfer should also speak with an UNO advisor to insure the optimal number of credits transfer. Only Courses with a grade of C or better will transfer and students must have a minimum overall grade point average of 2.5 or higher.
