Pass to Class

Metropolitan Community College (MCC) and Metro have teamed up to provide bus passes to MCC credit students for transportation to and from MCC locations along regular Metro routes and for other education-related purposes.

Rules

1. The Pass to Class will be used for getting to and from MCC locations and for other education-related purposes.
2. The Pass to Class is to be used only by the student enrolled in credit classes at MCC. Use by someone other than the enrolled participant may result in termination from the program. Passes may not be transferred between individuals and will be deactivated upon voluntary or involuntary disenrollment from MCC classes.
3. One Pass to Class pass will be issued at the start of each quarter; thereafter, the student is subject to a \$25 fee for the replacement of any lost or stolen bus pass.
4. All Metro rules and regulations must be followed. Failure to abide by the Metro rules and regulations may result in termination from the program.

Card void if laminated, mutilated, or altered in any way. Sharing of the pass is not permitted. Misuse may result in confiscation. Not responsible for lost or stolen passes.

Helpful Tips from Metro

Where to Start

Plan out your bus ride online <http://trip-planner.metroareatransit.com/> by phone at (402) 341-0800 (VOICE) / (402) 341-0807 (TDD).

When you call, have a pencil and paper ready to record your trip information. Tell the Customer Service Operator where your trip starts, your destination and the times you want to arrive and return.

Reading Schedules

Individual schedules are available for each route in the system. Each schedule includes the following:

- Boarding times at selected time points along the route for each trip made on weekdays and/or Saturday and Sunday.
- A route map identifying the regular route and any special routing used on selected trips.
- Information on fares, transfers, holiday service, the Customer Service phone number, reduced fare eligibility criteria and areas served by the route.
- Transfer points and the routes you can transfer to.

Identifying Your Bus

The destination and route numbers are displayed on digital signs located above the windshield and to the left of the front door.

Hailing Your Bus

Stay by the bus sign and wave your arm to have the bus stop. Be at the stop three to five minutes before the bus is scheduled to arrive. If you have questions or want to confirm this is the correct bus to reach your destination, ask the operator prior to boarding.

Boarding

Let seniors and the disabled board first. The center facing seats located in the front of the bus are reserved for seniors and the disabled.

Standing

In the event you must stand, move behind the white line and as far to the rear of the bus as possible. This allows the operator to see the rear door and make room for additional passengers. For your safety, use the handholds on the seats and overhead rails since buses may have to make sudden stops.

Fareboxes

Fareboxes accept coins, bills and Metro pre-paid fare cards (Pass to Class cards). The top of the farebox has three slots: one for coins, one for dollar bills and one for fare passes. Passes, once activated, must be swiped in the magnetic swipe slot. If a fare is rejected, the farebox 'warbles'. Passenger must pay fare with either cash or a different card.

Transfers

A transfer is required for persons riding more than one bus to reach their destination. A transfer must be paid for when the fare is deposited and is issued by the farebox. The backside of the transfer has the following information: time issued, date, bus number, route number and the time the transfer expires.

Exiting the Bus

When the bus is within a block of your destination, press the yellow strip or pull the cord next to or above the windows to signal the operator that you want to get off the bus. After the bus stops, move to the rear door to exit the bus. Do not enter the stairwell until the bus comes to a complete stop and the green light signals that the door will be opening.
